## **About this pre-visit resource**

This pre-visit resource gives you detailed information about the session you are attending with your class, as well as some extra tips about our venue, so that you can be well prepared for your visit to The Box.

## **About this workshop**

This workshop takes place in the permanent galleries at The Box. During the session, students are shown a box of mystery objects and are challenged to connect them to significant individuals and landmarks in Plymouth's past. Guided around the galleries students explore objects and take part in sensory activities related to these characters whilst completing an illustrated map to take back to school.

### **Curriculum links:**

**History:** Local history study: A study of an aspect or theme in British history that

extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066.

Geography: Mapwork - recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

English: Pupils should be taught to speak clearly and convey ideas confidently

## **Detailed Workshop Outline**

#### 1

The session begins by the Schools Learning
Facilitator introducing the students to their
challenge: "Today we need your help! We have found
a box of mixed-up objects and each one belongs to
an important person from Plymouth's history. We
are going to go on a tour around the galleries to find
the people that helped make Plymouth the place it
is today, and together we will figure which part of
history each object comes from!"

#### 2

The students will use an illustrated map to record the information and objects they discover as they tour the galleries, placing the individuals and landmarks in a historic timeline.

#### 3

Whilst visiting the displays handling objects and primary source materials will be shown to the class, representing five real people from Plymouth's history. Students will learn object enquiry skills to understand how Plymouth and the wider world has changed over time.

#### 4

Visiting each display the students will take part in a sensory activity to further their understanding between the character and their landmark including smells and sounds.

#### 5

In the final gallery the students will discuss the evidence they have gathered on their illustrated maps and address any gaps left in their knowledge.

#### 6

The Schools Learning Facilitator will summarise what the students have learnt during their last session and ask the students to place the mystery objects in historical order using the knowledge they have gained.

#### 7

To conclude the session, the students will imagine and draw themselves as the next important person in Plymouth's history. Forming part of their illustrated map the students will take these back to school after the session.
